Prof Dr Adinegara Bin Lutfi Abas started his career by completing initially MBBS followed by Master of Public Health in University of Malaya which he obtained in 1997. He initially worked in the Ministry of Health, Malaysia as District Health Officer and Occupational Health Officer since then till December 2000. Later he acquired the opportunity to work as Lecturer in Melaka Manipal Medical College. He was given the responsibility of handling examination matters in the College as Representative of Registrar-Evaluation in December 2008 and later helmed duties as Deputy Dean in 2010 and thereafter as Dean, Faculty of Medicine in January 2018.

He has been actively involved in various committees within the Institution such as the Learning Outcomes Committee, OSCE and e-Learning Committee amongst others. He has published fifty-eight articles (Appendix 1) in both local and international journals in the field of public health, occupational health and systematic reviews. He has also been involved in the peer review process of several journals such as the Medical Journal of Malaysia, Asia Pacific Journal of Public Health and International Journal of Occupational and Environmental Health. He is a current member of the Clinical Research Committee of Hospital Melaka,

advisor for the Clinical Research Committee of Hospital Muar and research facilitator / advisor plus quality assurance facilitator for Health State of Melaka.

He obtained FAIMER Fellowship in medical education from Christian Medical College, Ludhiana, India in 2013. He later acquired Certificate for Synergic Manipal Integrated Leadership Engagement (SMILE) programme from MAHE, India in 2015. In September 2013, he was elected as a Malaysian Network Coordinator for Malaysian Cochrane Network Center.

He was made Chief Facilitator for Malaysia Public Health's Workshop On Monitoring & Evaluation of Public Health Program in 2013 which was supported by World Health Organization. In June 2015, he was awarded MAGEX, MAHE award for Excellence in Academics – Melaka Manipal Medical College. He is also a current Malaysian Qualifications Agency(MQA) full panel from 2014 onwards. From 2019 onwards, he was made the Chairperson of the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA) accreditation team.
